Ethical Implications: Working with Criminal Justice Clients

Specialists in substance use disorder, mental health and criminal justice professions are bound by a code of ethics, especially important in the human services field. This 3 hour presentation will focus on the ethical concerns related to working with the criminal justice population. The intent is to engage professionals in a process of recognizing ethical dilemmas and participating in the use of ethical decision making on a consistent basis.

- Discuss ethical practices that enhance professionals to explore value systems
- Recognize the unique confidentiality requirements for SUD treatment programs.
- Identify risk and protective factors within ethical practice
- Discuss ethical standards for human services professionals
- Review five major ethical violations common in counseling.
