SCIP INTERVENTION & PREVENTION TRAINING

About the Training

Serving high-risk youth presents a challenge for today's educators. Mental health issues, alcohol and other drug use, changing family systems, and child abuse often result in classroom behaviors which can interfere with a student's ability to learn.

The School Community Intervention & Prevention (SCIP) program provides a systematic approach for schools and communities to respond to those high-risk behaviors.

SCIP facilitates partnerships with schools and community agencies, identifying resources available to address problems related to mental health, student abuse of alcohol or other drugs, and other behavioral concerns.

Through a confidential process, students experiencing difficulties can be referred to a school SCIP team by parents, peers, school personnel, or anyone else concerned about a student. A SCIP team consists of school representatives who are trained to identify risk factors, intervene and assist, connect with community agencies, and provide support for students and their families.

SCIP partners with community behavioral health agencies who will provide a screening for SCIP referred students, free of charge.

This training will provide you with the tools needed to recognize warning signs of at-risk behaviors and the ability to develop an appropriate plan to assist the student and his or her family through the process of getting the help they need.

Training Topics

The last hour of each day will be devoted to group work. During group activities, participants will discuss the SCIP process, team functioning, barriers to connecting families to services and case studies.
